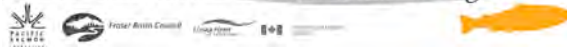

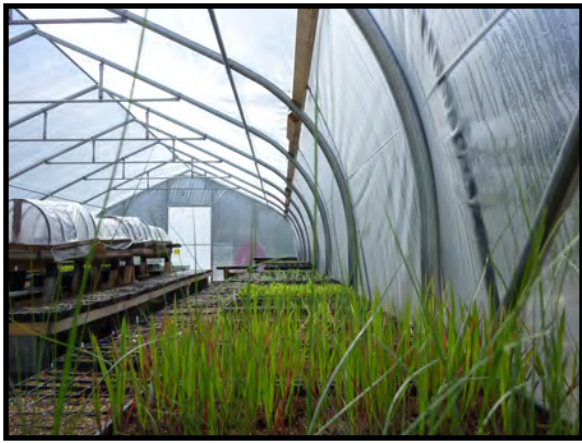

SPLIT ROCK SEKW'EL'WAS WILD PLANT NURSERY



AND RESTORATION SERVICES



INDIGENOUS PLANT PROPAGATION

All nursery stock intended for restoration or home landscaping is propagated ethically from seed collected within 20 kms of the intended planting site.

Seeds and cuttings are collected throughout the year and planted in the late fall or early spring. They are given an early start in the greenhouse or shade house, but are soon transferred to outdoor growing areas where they become adapted to the natural influences of sun, wind and rain.

We also salvage wild plants where they are going to be impacted by expansion of gardens, roads or construction.

Currently, we are propagating native plant species that benefit wildlife, provide traditional food values, and that are adapted to various microclimates.

Trees, shrubs, wildflowers and native grasses are all propagated at the Split Rock Nursery. Some riparian plants include cottonwood, willow, black hawthorn, red-osier dogwood, hooshum and dogbane. We have had a lot of success also with dryland plants, including sage, golden aster, brown-eyed Susan, penstemon, goldenrod, wild clematis and various native bunch grasses.

The nursery is open most week mornings from 8:00 am to 11:30 am. Please call if you would like to tour the facility or if you want to volunteer your time to assist us in this work.



RESTORATION FIELD WORK SERVICES and HOME GARDEN SOLUTIONS

Restoration work involves surveying and mapping potential restoration sites and developing a long-term plan for its management.



A comprehensive plan usually involves site contouring and complexing, weed removal strategies, and replanting with indigenous species suited to the restoration site. Vegetation and wildlife monitoring ensures success of the project.

In the near future, the restoration crew will be available for assisting you in garden design, plant choices and techniques for establishing a wild plant garden that is low-maintenance, low in water use and attracts wildlife to your garden at the same time!



NATURE OUTREACH PROGRAMS

Our restoration and outreach crew can provide educational, hands-on, and fun activities to enhance your existing programs and events. The goal of the nature programs are to instill a sense of wonder and understanding of our natural world locally and to provide resources that lead to stewardship and sustainable living within our watersheds.

Set events take place each month, BUT we will travel to your location, group or school and implement a program suited to your individual needs. All activities include a cultural, artistic, stewardship and scientific component.
